


This moving, thought-provoking, and surprising novel by an award-winning writer draws upon both history and today's headlines to illuminate the relationship between Islam and the West.

Alternating between Scotland, 2010, and the Caucasus mountains of the 19th Century, fascinating thematic lines are drawn connecting the world we live in and what history has borne in the past. First we meet Imam Shamil, the legendary leader of the Muslim tribes of the Northern Caucasus who became the head of the anti-Russian resistance in the 19th century's Caucasian War. As the Russian Empire pushed the boundaries of the Ottoman Empire and Persia, Shamil lead the last unification of Caucasian nations that fought desperately to resist Tsarist rule.

Switching to contemporary Scotland, here we meet Shamil's descendants, modern-day Muslims who occupy a broad spectrum of thought when it comes to religious beliefs, the meaning of "jihad", and how much one should and could assimilate into "traditional" British society. The heart of this story is Natasha – half Russian, half Sudanese – a professor of Islamic studies whose own personal history evokes the highs and lows of Islam's relationship with other cultures throughout recorded time. These two narratives inform, enhance, and challenge each other, resulting in a highly-accomplished, multilayered novel that takes our ideas, shakes them up, and helps us reach a better understanding of both history and the world as we currently know it.

Leila Aboulela won the first Caine Prize for African Writing and is one of contemporary literature's leading Muslim voices. She is author of the novels *The Translator, Minaret,* and *Lyrics Alley* resulting in multiple nominations for the Women's Prize for Fiction and the International IMPAC Dublin Literary Award. *The Translator* was a *New York Times* 100 Notable Books of the Year and *Lyrics Alley* was the Fiction Winner of the Scottish Book Awards. Born in Khartoum, Sudan, Aboulela lived much of her adult life in Scotland and now lives in Doha. www.leila-aboulela.com.





CITY ON FIRE is as big and sprawling as they come: a story spread over 900 pages, capturing the beating heart of New York in the tumultuous decade of the 1970s. Hallberg's exuberant, almost encyclopedic evocation of place; his virtuosic, freewheeling, neo-Jamesian prose; and his warm, deeply humane, generous ability to write character, make this an unforgettable read.

Set in New York City in the 1970s, CITY ON FIRE's extraordinary cast of characters includes the reluctant heirs to one of the city's biggest fortunes; two Long Island kids seduced by downtown's nascent punk scene; a gay schoolteacher who leaves rural Georgia for the home of Whitman and Wharton; a depressive magazine reporter obsessed with a single story; a revolutionary cell intent on setting the Bronx ablaze; a trader with a hole on his balance sheet and the corrupt capitalist who offers him a way to close it; and the detective who is trying to figure out what they all have to do with a shooting in Central Park when the infamous New York blackout of 13 July 1977 plunges the city into darkness.

Garth Risk Hallberg is the author of an illustrated novella, A FIELD GUIDE TO THE NORTH AMERICAN FAMILY (Mark Batty Publisher, 2007), which was nominated for the Believer Book Award. Garth's fiction has also been anthologized in Best New American Voices 2008, and he's been a finalist for the National Book Critics Circle's Balakian Prize for Excellence in Reviewing for the past two years running. He has been published in *The New York Times Magazine*, *The New York Times Book Review*, *New York Magazine*, *Slate*, *The Los Angeles Times*, and *The Millions* where he is a contributing editor. Everything changed, and the sudden availability of all the music ever recorded, for free, was a big part of why it did. Witt takes us to that moment—indeed, to the very people responsible for it. Neither music, nor the world itself, has been the same since.


The result of three years of research, HOW MUSIC GOT FREE interweaves three compelling narratives:

- The digital pirate. While there were millions of people downloading songs illegally, the number of people who actually leaked the latest music online was surprisingly small. One of the most notorious was Dell Glover: an entrepreneurial employee of a CD pressing plant in North Carolina who would sneak out new CD release under his belt buckle and then distribute online. Most of the biggest hits of the 1990s and 2000s were leaked online by Glover.
- The creators of the MP3. Two German audio engineers Karlheinz Brandenburg and Bernhard Grill - came up with a digital audio compression format MP3, but its success was by no means assured. Then they released the file - for free - on the Internet and it started to catch fire in ways they could have never predicted.
- The hit-making music executive. Doug Morris, arguably the most powerful and most successful
 music executive ever. He has run all the major labels and produced a veritable Who's Who of
 stars: Led Zeppelin, The Rolling Stones, U2, Mariah Carey, Jay-Z, Eminem, among many others.
 While he knew how to create a hit, he refused early on to embrace the new MP3 technology, a
 decision that would have profound effects on illegal downloading.

Stephen Richard Witt graduated from Columbia Journalism School in 2011; this book stemmed from his Master's thesis, which won a Lynton Fellowship. Witt graduated with a degree in Mathematics from the University of Chicago in 2001 and he worked as a financial analyst before attending journalism school. HOW MUSIC GOT FREE is his first book.
