David George Haskell's THE FOREST UNSEEN is one of the most honored works of narrative natural science of the past decade: a Pulitzer finalist, winner of the Best Book Award from the National Academies and other major prizes. His highly anticipated new book, SONGS OF TREES, will explore the mystery and meaning of Earth's deep biological networks and humanity's place in this constantly evolving nexus by following the lives of ten trees around the world and listening to what their voices are telling us.

Trees are full of song. Wind clatters and hisses through leaves and needles, insects stridulate, ice rends weakened wood, people chatter on the street below, and mechanical noises reverberate within trunks. Some tree sounds are too high or low for our ears, but can be heard with the right microphones: water coursing through plant veins, the slow oscillations of limbs in motion, and the vibrations of passing footsteps.


Under the acoustic surface are the hidden songs, the stories heard when we follow sounds to their sources. To attend to a tree's song is therefore to touch a stethoscope to the skin of a landscape, hearing what stirs below. Each song reveals the particularities of the tree's community. People are part of that community, so listening to trees gives us a new way to hear our own voices, to understand humanity's relationships with other species.

Trees have long served as symbols of important truths. They represent the *axis mundi*, the places of enlightenment or temptation, and the unifying evolutionary Tree of Life. They build humus, exhale oxygen, and create rain. Trees are the world's great ecological connectors, drawing together all terrestrial lifeforms within their bodies or among their limbs, humans included. Songs of trees are therefore rich, wide-ranging, and complicated.

Biological networks are the places where the ongoing ecological and evolutionary tensions between cooperation and conflict are continually reworked and negotiated. This applies to all parts of the network, including those parts that are connected to and comprised of humans and one of Haskell's themes is an examination of how these tensions play out in a world that is undergoing rapid change. Networks are being cut, frayed, rewired, and sometimes strengthened by the transformations underway in the Earth's physical and biological systems and by choosing trees that live in places that are affected by urbanization, climate change, human conflict, and large scale resource extraction, Haskell will be able to focus on this dramatic dynamic.

David Haskell was born in England and educated in France; he holds a B.A. from Oxford and a PhD in Ecology and Evolutionary Biology from Cornell. He is now a Professor of Biology at the

University of the South, where he has served as Chair of the Biology Department. Haskell's work has been lauded on a national level, both professionally (he has been recognized by the American Ornithologists Union for his significant contributions to ornithology and The American Societies Council of Learned Societies) and in the media (including coverage in *Natural History Magazine*, *USA Today* and BBC Wildlife).


In the 1600s, we meet the progenitors of two striving and gifted Parisian clans that would exert power and influence in the French royal court and governing elite for generations to come - the Magoulets and Chevrots. By 1719, on the eve of a devastating European financial crisis, both families had been seduced by and ensnared in new economic theories that promised unfettered, easy accumulation of wealth by means of taking on unprecedented financial risk, betting on stock market bubbles and attempting to leverage ever increasing debt to accumulate more assets (sound familiar?). When the system collapsed and Europe was simultaneously plagued by a heat wave that destroyed the harvests, France was plunged into chaos. From here Joan follows fabled court embroiderer Jean Magoulet and influential financial advisor Antoine Chevrot and explores how this crisis affected the lives of these families for decades to come, with often terrible results: emotional and physical abuse, attempts to disown, disinherit and deport children they could no longer support, bigamy, identity theft, epic legal battles for recognition that sapped what remained of family resources, perhaps even murder. Emblematic of this dislocation is the tragic "Romeo and Juliet" story of Louise Magoulet and her great love Louis Chervot. The families hatefully vowed to keep them apart, to the point of condemning the pregnant Louise as a common prostitute, imprisoning her and conspiring to ship her off to the new world as a forgotten criminal.

Greed, financial folly, the pursuit of luxury goods, economic inequality, political exploitation and the odd, unexpected innovations that happen in times of crisis are all part of this epic narrative that encompasses the stories of people who found themselves by chance of fate rotting in a cold cell in the Bastille, or reveling at Versailles or struggling to eke out a decent living in the simple neighborhoods of Paris.

Joan places the reader at the very center of this singular yet strangely familiar time and place and will draw on a trove of newly discovered documents that will ground her narrative in solid historical data. In her expert hands, THE QUEEN'S EMBROIDERER will be Joan's most

ambitious work to date, at once intimate and sweeping, evocative and pertinent, a book that will appeal to fans of such best-sellers as *The Girl with a Pearl Earring*, Geraldine Brooks's historical novels and Edmund de Waal's *The Hare with Amber Eyes*.

Joan DeJean has been Trustee Professor at the University of Pennsylvania since 1988. Before then, she taught at Princeton and Yale. She grew up in Louisiana in a French-speaking family and was educated at Newcomb College/Tulane and then at Yale. Joan has been awarded fellowships by the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and the American Council of Learned Societies. She is the winner of the MLA Aldo and Jeanne Scaglione Prize for French Studies.

Virtually everyone recognizes Paris as being an absolutely magical city and the first modern city. However, what they don't know is that Paris became the first modern city in the 17th century, not the 19th century. Over the course of the 17th century, Paris redefined the urban experience, the future became the focal point for the city and to accommodate this new way of life and the intensity and speed that went with it, Parisians developed visionary ways to adjust, such as establishing the first system of public transportation and the first intra-city mail system. The original system of street lighting that they created enabled Parisians (unlike anyone else across the globe) to enjoy theatre, dining out, shopping (at the first ever boutiques and shopping arcades) and public life well into the night. All these developments attracted people, as residents and tourists and gave rise to the anonymity of the urban life, which we're so familiar with now. While cities just as large across Europe may have been centers of trade, it was Paris that created and defined the urban experience as we know it today and did so in the most dazzling and enchanting way possible.



Written with DeJean's customary élan and deep research, THE AGE OF COMFORT traces the birth of the concepts of comfort, relaxation and privacy - hallmarks of the Western world. This was truly a revolution and it ushered in the concept of private life and a whole new way of seeing space and how people live in it, including specialized new rooms (i.e. bedrooms and bathrooms), upholstered furniture (which meant choices of arrays of fabrics, not just brocades) and furniture to lounge on (the arrival of the sofa, not seen since ancient Roman times).

None of this could have happened without a remarkable cast of visionaries, who by great good fortune were in the same place at the right time. They included Louis XV's two mistresses, Madame du Barry and Madame de Pompadour, who truly invented the modern style of relaxation and comfort in the home and their team of brilliant architects and the first interior designers. The sensibilities of these people would have a direct influence on clothing (designed for the first time for comfort, as well as style), literature (the rise of and passion for novels of seduction and love letters) and the interaction between the sexes (the newly created sofa was the first piece of furniture, not only upholstered, but designed for two).







A THOUSAND NAKED STRANGERS is a vital, finely written memoir about the dark, gory, sometimes heartbreaking, often hilarious and always exhilarating exploits of a burned-out paramedic operating out of a teeming urban public hospital.

In his late 20s, Kevin was drifting, newly married, working as a stringer for a local newspaper, thinking about joining the military post 9/11, when he almost accidently signs up for EMS training at a community college. Soon he knows in his bones that he has found his calling in this edgy, terrifyingly random, yet hauntingly intimate job of answering emergency calls from people young to old in serious trouble. His patients experience medical emergencies ranging from "the usual" on his beat (massive drop-to-the-floor heart attacks, brutal, mangling car accidents, the everyday domestic arguments that casually escalate to stabbings and shootings) to the weird (toes chopped clean off when a weed snapper slips, suffocation by errant broccoli floret) to the downright bizarre (attempted suicide by means of swallowing four 22-caliber bullets and three Tylenol – turns out not *nearly* good enough for a trip to the other side).

Kevin does what he can - tube open the airway, crack the ribs with CPR, run the morphine line, staunch the blood, duck the vomit – and some in his care make it through, some don't, those are the rules of the game of improv he shares with his partners on the truck. But how long can he play? After ten years, with kids of his own to worry about, in all honesty, he just doesn't know...

Kevin is a crucial actor in these dramas of survival, his every decision, his every motion potentially determinant of a complete stranger's final fate. But he is also a vigilant witness to the shifting red line that seems to arbitrarily separate the living and the dead and his lucid observation of each individual's strange, deeply personal journey to the edge and beyond honors and elevates his subject in the best literary tradition. His narrative is effortlessly immediate, mordantly witty, self-revelatory in flashes of startling insight -- perfect for readers eager for a memoir that is powerfully involving and hard to forget.

Kevin Hazzard's memoir started as a blog that gained readership throughout the US and beyond and led to an option from two producers at FX – the project is currently being shopped to production companies. His work as a freelance journalist has appeared in *Atlanta Magazine*, *Creative Loafing* and *Past* and his first novel, *Sleeping Dogs*, was published by Mercer University Press, and heralded by Pat Conroy as "perfectly wonderful."

BLINDED BY FOCUS by MIT-trained economist Vikram Mansharamani, (currently a fellow at the Kennedy School at Harvard and lecturer at Yale University) is a fascinating, "big idea" book about a critical "malfunction" of our time – a massive deficit of common sense, an inability to see "the big picture" – that profoundly affects everyone's life in manifold domains, with the impact felt in our health care, our personal finances, commerce, transportation, energy, education and the global economic system at large.

In a series of involving on-point stories and vivid examples drawn straight from current headlines, Mansharamani adroitly examines the variety of causes for this often unacknowledged, but deeply unbalanced dynamic and proposes a series of creative solutions to reclaim our critical ability to think for ourselves and successfully navigate uncertainty.

BLINDED BY FOCUS is an "intellectual adventure story" perfect for the Gladwell readership eager for fresh insight into how we really function as individuals and as a society and an urgent call to action for a course change. The writing here is lucid and engaging and the subject and message hugely relevant. It's a book that we truly need.

We see the evidence everywhere, from events cataclysmic to ordinary—(and we all can fill in tales of our own "system failures"):

- A major medical center discharges a patient presenting a 104 degree fever, despite the fact that he recently arrived from the epicenter of the Ebola epidemic in Africa.
- Air France Flight 447, a routine run from Rio to Paris, belly-flops into the Atlantic because the pilots forget the basic rules of aviation when a data system fails.
- A heart patient signs on with the "wrong" specialist for major surgery, unaware that his doctor's expertise in angioplasty and stents may not actually be the right course of treatment for his particular condition.
- A man blindly follows his GPS and drives his van up a hiking trail until the system announces he should turn around: he's now halfway up a mountain and requires rescue by a heavy-lift helicopter.

As Mansharamani states:

"These events indicate we are suffering deeply from a lack of faith in our own judgment -- a deficiency driven by the seemingly unstoppable march towards increasing specialization, devout obedience to and forgiveness for problematically siloed expertise, and an increasing reliance upon technology, automation, and

systems. Sadly, virtually all indicators point to the situation getting silently worse. *Blinded by Focus* is a wake-up call. It's an alarm bell designed to highlight the subtle undercurrents of life that are leading us astray and the absolute necessity to think for ourselves."

In an attempt to automate processes and increase efficiency, we've created electronic experts and have outsourced thinking to them. In some sense, this is a hugely positive development in terms of productivity, but our unwavering commitment to technology and "data" often trumps common sense and the obvious can become dangerously obfuscated. We need experts but also must demand that they think in terms of mission, not task and never lose sight of a clear objective.

The book will articulate four primary messages that will ring true for everyone who senses the atrophy of our critical thinking and the vulnerability and dependence this engenders:

- (1) We need to again restore our faith in our own common sense;
- (2) We must overcome our love affair with technology—it's a tool and cannot replace thinking;
- (3) We should keep experts on tap, not on top and understand that the revered status specialists and experts have attained needs to change; and
- (4) We all have the ability, responsibility, and indeed necessity to see the big picture and connect the dots because not doing so is likely to create more problems than it solves.

Vikram Mansharamani's C.V. is diverse and impressive. He is currently the President of Kelan Advisors, LLC, a Lecturer at Yale University, and a Senior Fellow at the Mossavar-Rahmani Center for Business and Government at the Harvard Kennedy School. A frequent keynote speaker on global economic issues, he has given over 100 talks in the past two years to audiences ranging in size from 20 to several thousand. He is the author of the well-received Boombustology: Spotting Financial Bubbles Before They Burst (Wiley, 2011) and has served as a regular commentator in the financial and business media, contributing to Bloomberg, MarketWatch, CNBC, Forbes, Fortune, The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, TheDailyBeast, and The Atlantic, among others. Mansharamani teaches two of the most popular courses at Yale University: "Financial Booms & Busts" and "Adventures in Business Ethics." His Business Ethics class was the most oversubscribed class in the most popular major for the Spring 2015 semester.

As Amy soon found out, working with shelter dog is not all face licks and walks in the park--it's wrestling with harnesses, playing tug of war for hours with a pent up pit-mix, it's wondering if your outing will end with canine jaws latched onto your thigh, it's bring home needy dogs for sleepovers that never involve any sleep. But as Amy found success in helping even the most discouraged, troubled dogs adapt, change and slowly bloom and emerge adoptable, she knew she had found her life's calling.



Jonathan Moore is rapidly coming into his own as an exciting new talent in the thriller field, as his first two books, REDHEADS (Samhain), a finalist for the Bram Stoker Award, and CLOSE REACH (Hydra/Random House) prove.

THE POISON ARTIST is an impressive next step for Moore: a gripping, finely written literary thriller about obsession and damage, about a decent man unmoored by an unspeakable past and a mysterious and irresistible woman who promises him the blissful dream of release and escape. There are echoes here of timeless noir narratives -- including Hitchcock's classic Vertigo – but updated with fascinating CSI detail and accuracy and told with masterful pacing and a growing sense of menace that is truly chilling.

Dr. Caleb Maddox is a brilliant San Francisco toxicologist leading a NIH-funded study of the human pain threshold based on minute analysis of chemical markers. He has also just broken up with his artist girlfriend after a bitter argument. Caleb needs to get out of their house and retreats to a downtown hotel, then wanders out into the foggy evening in search of whiskey and solitude. At the House of Shields, a venerable old saloon, an exotic, delicately beautiful woman materializes out of the shadows, dressed like a 1940s movie star and scented with a perfume like "midnight dew;" she shares a pouring of absinthe with Caleb, brushes his arm and vanishes. An overwhelming romantic obsession blooms – Caleb must find her and his desperate search leads him through the dark back ways of a brooding city. As he pursues Emmeline, he learns her painful secrets – is she his salvation or something dangerous that lives in darkness? At the same time, Caleb becomes entangled in a serial murder investigation that has the police flummoxed – men gone missing, fished out of the bay, with no clue as to how they met their grim demise. One

of the men was at the bar the night Emmeline appeared. Caleb is questioned, but he can't offer any information. Meanwhile, after office hours, he surreptitiously helps his old friend city coroner Henry Newcombe examine the victims and unravel the chemical evidence left in the bloated remains.

The deeply drawn characters and the perfectly and powerfully rendered atmosphere (San Francisco has never felt more alluring) provide an emotional punch that will leave the reader involved in Caleb and Emmeline's strange journey long after the novel concludes. And being based on intensive research, the book also delivers fascinating scientific information on pain and more esoteric matters, like what happens to a body thrown into San Francisco Bay (and why it's particularly gruesome). The deep research Moore has done is not only interesting, it immediately gives the author real credibility, which creates the trust essential for a reader to truly lose themselves in the plot.

Nazila Fathi grew up in Iran, spent three years in London as a child and left again to go to college. She lived in Iran until the night in 2009 when nine men stood outside of her apartment building waiting to arrest her (most likely on a charge of being a spy). From 1992 to 2010 she was a stringer for *The New York Times*, *Time Magazine* and *Agence France Press*, writing over 3,000 articles over the last decade. Conducting literally thousands of interviews with everyone

from the most militant dissidents to Ayatollahs, she was able to give readers insights and an understanding of the culture, politics and people of Iran. Unlike reporters who drop in to cover a country, Fathi was a part of the culture she was reporting on, but could also see it with the eyes of a Westerner, having lived and studied in the West. Her understanding and insights are unique, since she lived and reported from what is the essence of "ground level".




The frame of the story is a dramatic, harrowing, richly detailed account of the day that Collins shot himself in the foot when he was a teenager on a deer hunting trip with his Dad and brothers in the remote Nevada wilderness, 10 miles from the nearest road, 120 miles from the nearest hospital. Cutting back and forth from that experience – his father, terrified yet coolly in command, examining his bloody foot, carrying Collins on his back to a trail crossing, leaving him behind in blinding pain to get his truck, which may or may not make it up the mountain-- are vignettes of Collins's growing up years in 1970s rural Nevada, where gun violence incidents are never far away but somehow rarely spoken about: the neighborhood kid shot while hunting

rabbits, the local pol who blows his head off after losing an election. We also discover fascinating facts about the ingenious machinery of the gun and revisit Collins's own family history going back to his great, great grandfather, who fought alongside Zachary Taylor in the brutal Black Hawk Indian Wars of 1832, a shared past and ethos that is part of the Western character to this day.

Craig Collins started his career as a reporter and an editor for *The San Diego Union-Tribune's* Copley News Service, where his articles were published in major newspapers across the country. 

He returns home to Alabama to try to write a memoir about his time in the whirlwind, but the words fail to come.


The surprise return of his Vietnam veteran brother gives Willie a chance to drive a load of smuggled guns to the Motor City – and make enough money to jump-start his stalled dream of writing his movement memoir. There, at Tiger Stadium on Opening Day of the 1968 baseball season – postponed two days in deference to the funeral of Martin Luther King, Jr. – Willie learns some terrifying news: the Detroit police are still investigating the last unsolved murder from the bloody, apocalyptic riot of the previous summer, and a white cop named Frank Doyle will not rest until the case is solved. And Willie is his prime suspect.

There are few places on earth as magnificent as the Antarctic Peninsula, where towering, glaciated mountains drop straight into the iceberg-covered Southern Ocean. This uninhabited land, discovered less than two centuries ago, is also home to one of the world's most beloved and charming creatures, the Adelie penguin. In recent decades, the Antarctic Peninsula has earned



This book goes straight to the heart of the conflict: into the minds of suicide bombers and inside Israeli tanks. We hear from Palestinian informants who help the Israeli military track down and kill Palestinian militants. Israeli settlers in isolated outposts explain why they are there, and we hear the frustrations of a Palestinian farmer who has had his olive grove cut in half by Israel's security barrier. It convincingly explains how the landscape of the conflict changed and why the traditional approach to peacemaking is no longer valid

With a new perspective on what's really going on in Israel and the Palestinian territories, *The Familiar War* is a book that will inform the debate on the Middle East and the future of the peace process, as well as our understanding of other conflicts around the world.

Greg Myre is now a senior editor at *National Public Radio's* Morning Edition program. He was with *The New York Times* and *The Associated Press* for over twenty years. Jennifer Griffin is the national security correspondent for Fox News and before that was with several other news agencies. Myre and Griffin have worked in more than fifty different countries, covering many flashpoints in the Muslim world, including Iran, Afghanistan, Iraq, Lebanon, Kosovo and Chechnya. They now live in Washington DC after spending eight years in Jerusalem for the *New York Times* and Fox News respectively.





SLOW GETTING UP, by a six year veteran of the National Football League who happens to also be a talented, witty writer of fast-paced narrative non-fiction, is the funniest, most heartbreaking, most exhilarating, most honest book about life inside professional sports written in a long time.
