

ALL RIGHTS RESERVED by Gregory Scott Katsoulis





SLEEP LIKE A BABY by Charlaine Harris




JANITORS OF THE POST-APOCALYPSE by Jim C. Hines

The Krakau arrived on Earth with the intention to invite humanity to join a growing alliance of sentient species. Unfortunately, they arrived just after humans were nearly wiped out by a terrible plague, leaving the survivors as zombie-like creatures living in the ruins of civilization—your standard apocalypse. In an attempt toward mercy, the Krakau decide to help fix the ruins of Planet Earth. This new humorous science fiction trilogy follows Marion “Mops” Adamopoulos, the very bright (for a human) Lieutenant in charge of the Shipboard Hygiene and Sanitation team. French and Japanese rights to the first book have sold, and there is now material available for The Genesis Fleet #2, ASCENDANT, which will be released in May 2018. THE APOCALYPSE GUARD by Brandon Sanderson

We're excited to announce that #1 NYT bestselling author Brandon Sanderson is launching a new YA trilogy! Just as Brandon's adult novels are all interconnected via the ever-growing Cosmere universe, The Apocalypse Guard is set in the same universe as his first YA series, The Reckoners. In this new series, infinite alternate dimensions exist, and many of them are unstable. That's where the Apocalypse Guard comes in: an organization of thousands of scientists, engineers, and extraordinary individuals who save planets. Emma is the Guard's summer intern. When a shadowy group attacks and throws the Guard into chaos, Emma is cast through dimensions and finds herself stranded on a doomed planet, woefully inexperienced and unprepared to solve this crisis. Delacorte will publish the first book in summer 2018. Series rights to the Apocalypse Guard have sold in Spain and Turkey well ahead of publication. 
REE VAREKAI NOVELLAS by Marie Brennan

She does not even know her own name, though she begins to go by Ree Varekai. These novellas introduce a great new universe for the Prix Imaginales Award-winning Brennan, which flips the script on the American Gods concept, taps into the prolonged appeal of Magic: The Gathering, and makes for a fantastic magic system. 
NANOSHOCK (SINless #2) by K. C. Alexander — November 2, 2017


DEAD BUT ONCE by Auston Habershaw — April 2018


I AM STILL ALIVE by Kate Marshall — Spring 2018

After a car crash kills Jess's mother and leaves Jess so injured she can barely walk, she is forced to live with her survivalist dad in his cabin in the remote Canadian wilderness. Just as she begins to get to know him, a secret from his past pays them a visit, leaving her father dead and Jess stranded. With only her father's dog for company, Jess must forage and hunt for food, build shelter, and keep herself warm. Some days it feels like the wild is out to destroy her, but Jess must survive. She knows who killed her father...and she wants revenge. *Manuscript available for review.*



AN EASY DEATH (Gunnie Rose #1) by Charlaine Harris — 2018

AN EASY DEATH launches a brand new series from Charlaine Harris, NYT bestselling author of the Sookie Stackhouse series (adapted to HBO's True Blood), the Aurora Teagarden series (adapted for TV movies on Hallmark), and the Midnight, Texas series (adapted for TV by NBC). In this compulsively readable alternate history, America has split into five smaller territories after being weakened by the Great Depression. Lizbeth Rose is a “gunnie,” the hired help who gets people safely to their destinations across a harsh landscape, and she's been asked to help find a relative of the Russian prince whose blood can keep him alive. 


Daniel José Older launches two middle grade series in 2018

But his loyalty is tested when the infection hits too close to home.

ZOJAQAN by Collin Kelly and Jackson Lanzing, art by Nathan Gooden: In the aftermath of war, Shannon Kind discovers that the village she once protected has become something darker and more brutal.
