


ROOTLESS opens with Sam discovering that his wife, Efe, has left him and their daughter and returned to Chana. Sam is shocked - their marriage was perfect. Or was it? ROOTLESS is a portrait of a British-Ghanaian marriage in crisis, as well as posing the question: can you ever really go home?

Best friends Efe and Sam meet as teenagers in 90s London. Efe is a new arrival in the UK from Ghana, sinking under the weight of her parents' expectations. Sam is focused and idealistic, taking his first steps towards a career in corporate law. Over the years that follow the best friends become lovers, then marry. But an unplanned pregnancy forces them to confront just how radically different they want their lives to be. Soon Efe is swallowed up by the demands of motherhood, the dreams for her life dangling from a thread. And when she leaves, disappearing one morning and leaving both Sam and their daughter behind, Sam's illusion of their perfect marriage crumbles. He's about to discover exactly who he's married to and the lengths he'll go to win her back.

This is beautifully written and provocative reading group fiction, with much to discuss around love, marriage, motherhood, and if you can ever really 'go home'. I would see ROOTLESS sitting alongside novels such as Lauren Groff's Fates and Furies, Sally Rooney's Normal People and Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie's Americanah. Krystle's second novel, HINTERLANDS, will explore the complex and competitive relationships that can exist between sisters, plus the secrets lurking in a close-knit community.

Krystle Zara Appiah is a Ghanaian writer and screenwriter, born and raised in London. She has a degree in literature and creative writing from the University of Kent. In 2020, she was one of forty writers selected for the London Library's Emerging Writers Programme. She also works as a children's books editor.

ROOTLESS is her debut novel.

Nella is desperate to find Thea a husband who will guarantee her future, and when they receive an invitation to Amsterdam's most exclusive ball, she is overjoyed – perhaps this will set their fortunes straight. Jessie Burton studied at Oxford University and The Central School of Speech and Drama. Rights to *The Miniaturist*, her first novel, sold in forty territories around the world, the bulk of which were sold at auction. Her second and third novels, *The Muse* and *The Confession* also became bestsellers. She has written the children's illustrated titles *The Restless Girls*, and *Medusa* which will be published in 2021.



Connected by a passion for art, they soon fall in love. But as she becomes closer to him, their association increasingly puts her in danger of violent reprisals from the local people. At the same time, her covert work, creating false identity cards to camouflage those hiding from the Third Reich, brings her under the scrutiny of the occupying enemy.

As the Allied invasion draws closer, Marguerite has to work out who she can trust in a world where everything is at stake. Or by trusting a man so full of contradictions, will she be aligning her fate with that of a man whose heart she cannot know?





It is 2005 and Harley has just dropped out of an undergraduate course in music journalism, having led his estranged father to believe that he was training to become a chemical engineer. Moving back to a shared flat in Kent, and in the midst of an unfulfilling affair with an abusive older white man, he feels lost and isolated. But when his attempt to finally end things is interrupted by his flatmate, Muddy, his perspective on life changes.

Muddy is everything Harley isn't: confident in his masculinity, ostensibly heterosexual, warm and straight forward. Slowly, their friendship blossoms as Muddy introduces Harley to the things he loves—birdwatching, Oasis, rugby—and Harley starts to believe that life may, after all, be worth living. In turns a moving depiction of mental health, queerness, race and masculinity, as well as a sometimes hilarious coming-of-age story, Life Savings is a breath-taking first novel that marks the arrival of a major new talent.

Elvin James Mensah is a 27 year old British-Ghanaian writer born and raised in South East London. He received his Bachelor of Arts in English and Journalism from Bournemouth University, where he began writing his first novel. When not writing about blackness and queerness, he can be found voraciously explaining either the interconnectivity of the Marvel Cinematic Universe to his long-suffering friends, or the everlasting cultural impact of the Spice Girls. His other hobbies include drinking copious amounts of Capri Sun and re-reading Donna Tartt and Hanya Yanigihara novels.
