Feed Your Mind captures the inspirational and pivotal moments in August's life that led him to become one of America's greatest playwrights.

Born in 1945, Freddy Kittel, aka August Wilson, learned to read from items in his mother's pantry, soup labels and the backs of cereal boxes. He honed this love of reading at the library, where he graduated from the Hardy Boys to the shelf called "Negro Books"—Hughes, Dunbar, Ellison, Wright—Freddy read them all.

Freddy faced prejudice in school, both from students and teachers, and twice felt compelled to drop out of high school. Instead of learning in a traditional classroom, Freddy walked the streets of Pittsburgh, watching and listening, and continuing to read and educate himself. When Freddy sat down to write, he knew that he needed a name that would help define his work—and so "August Wilson" was born. Marrying careful observation with a rich imagination, August Wilson came to win two Pulitzer prizes by crafting plays in an authentic everyday voice that explored the real lives of black Americans.

Jen Bryant is the author of the Caldecott Honor-winning picture book *River of Words* and many other picture books for children. **Cannaday Chapman** received his BA in illustration from the School of Visual Arts. *Feed Your Mind* will be his first picture book.

Mister Rogers is one of the most beloved television personalities, but before he was the man who brought us *Mister Rogers' Neighborhood*, he was just little Freddie Rogers. With their support, he learned how to better say what he was feeling and see the beauty around him. As he grew up, he realized he could spread the message of compassion, equality, and kindness through television. *You Are My Friend* is a gentle homage to Fred Rogers and shows how his simple message still resonates with us today: "There's no person in the world like you and I like you just the way you are." The book includes a short biography of Fred's life and a bibliography.

After losing her mother very early in life, Anna Atkins (1799–1871) was raised by her loving father. He gave her a scientific education, which was highly unusual for women and girls in the early 19th century. Fascinated with the plant life around her, Anna became a botanist. She recorded all her findings in detailed illustrations and engravings, until the invention of cyanotype photography in 1842. Weaving together histories of women, science, and art, *The Bluest of Blues* will inspire young readers to embark on their own journeys of discovery and creativity.

Elizabeth Warren shares the incredible story of the first female senator of Massachusetts. Elizabeth came from a struggling middle-class family in Oklahoma City. After a heart attack put Elizabeth's father out of work, she helped out by babysitting, waitressing, and sewing, all while shining as a star member of her school's debate team. Debate taught Elizabeth how to fight with her words, a skill that eventually won her a state championship and a college scholarship. Today she continues to fight (with her words) for the poor and middle-class in her role as a senator. *Elizabeth Warren* emphasizes the importance of being outspoken—of using your words to fight for both yourself and for those who need your help.

To become the first female Jewish Supreme Court Justice, the unsinkable Ruth Bader Ginsburg had to overcome countless injustices. Growing up in Brooklyn in the 1930s and '40s, Ginsburg was discouraged from working by her father, who thought a woman's place was in the home. Regardless, she went to Cornell University, where men outnumbered women four to one. There, she met her husband, Martin Ginsburg, and found her calling as a lawyer. Despite discrimination against Jews, females, and working mothers, Ginsburg went on to become Columbia Law School's first tenured female professor, a judge for the US Court of Appeals, and finally, a Supreme Court Justice.

José de la Luz Sáenz (1888–1953)—or Luz—believed in fighting for what was right. Although he was born in the United States, he and his family experienced prejudice because of their Mexican heritage. When World War I broke out, Luz volunteered to join the fight. Because of his ability to quickly learn languages, he became part of the Intelligence Office in Europe. However, despite his hard work and intellect, Luz often didn't receive credit for his contributions. Upon his return to the US, he joined other Mexican-Americans whom he had met in the army to fight for equality. His contribution, along with others, ultimately led to the creation of the League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC), which is the oldest Latino civil rights organization. *Soldier for Equality* is based in part on Luz's diary during the war. It includes a biography of Luz's later years, an author's note, a timeline, a bibliography, and an index.

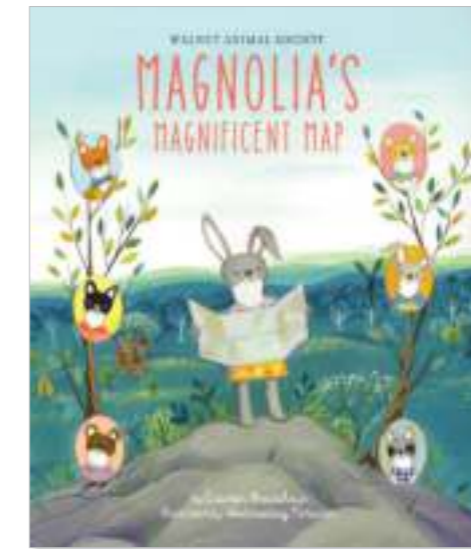
