C.K. Chau's **GOOD FORTUNE** is a retelling of *Pride & Prejudice* set in early-2000s Chinatown. Imbued with all the wit, romance, and incisive social commentary of the original, and reinvigorated with a sense of place that be-

longs wholly to the present, it reads like a **CRAZY RICH ASIANS** from the opposite side of the class divide—if Kevin Kwan were a woman from blue-collar American Chinatown.

When Elizabeth Chen's unlicensed realtor mother finally sells the derelict community center down the block, the new owners don't look like slumlords. Brendan Lee and Darcy Wong are good Chinese boys with Hong Kong money—clean-cut, charismatic, and committed to cleaning up the neighborhood. Elizabeth knows what that means: Their rent is about to go up.

But where clever, cynical Elizabeth sees lemons, her mother sees lemonade. Eager to get her five daughters ahead in the world (and out of their crammed family apartment), Mrs. Chen takes every opportunity to keep her investors close. Closer than Elizabeth likes.

To preserve the soul of the Chinatown she loves, Elizabeth is determined to fight for community over profit, but prickly, standoffish Darcy makes it clear that the opinions of people like her don't matter. That's fine. She doesn't need his approval and doesn't want anything to do with him—until a shocking betrayal from within upends the Chen family and forces Elizabeth to reconsider everything she believes about love, trust, and what kind of person Darcy Wong really is.

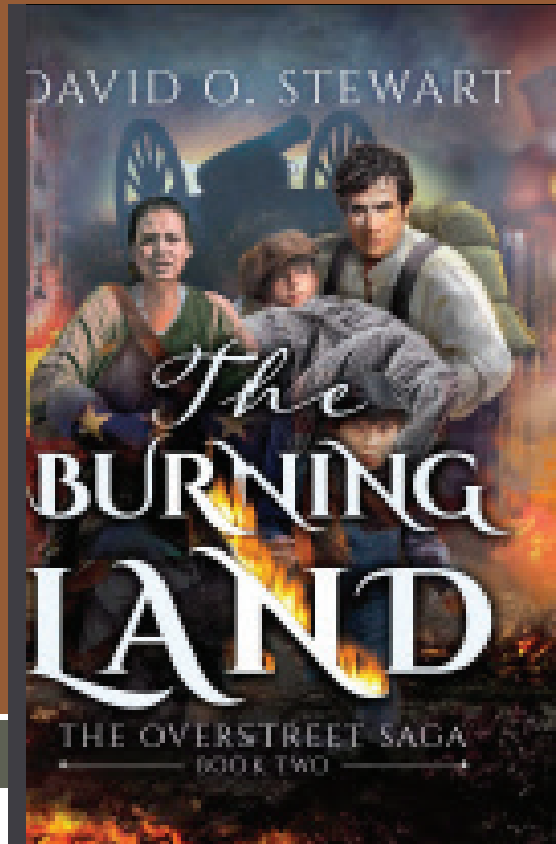

Rising to sergeant through furious battles at Fredericksburg and Gettysburg, Henry's two-week leave allows them to marry on the Fourth of July, 1864, and know a very few days of bliss.

Their trials, however, only multiply. Katie helps nurse Henry back from a grisly battlefield wound, but he recoils from the prospect of settling back in small-town Waldoboro. Dreaming of new horizons and an expansive future, Henry uproots their young family for booming Chicago. But little goes right in the overnight metropolis, testing their love and faith as never before.

After many years as a trial and appellate lawyer, David O. Stewart became a bestselling writer of history and historical fiction. His first novel, *The Lincoln Deception*, was about the John Wilkes Booth Conspiracy. Sequels include *The Paris Deception*, set at the Paris Peace Conference in 1919, and *The Babe Ruth Deception*, which follows Babe's early years with the Yankees. Released in November 2021, *The New Land* began the Overstreet Saga.

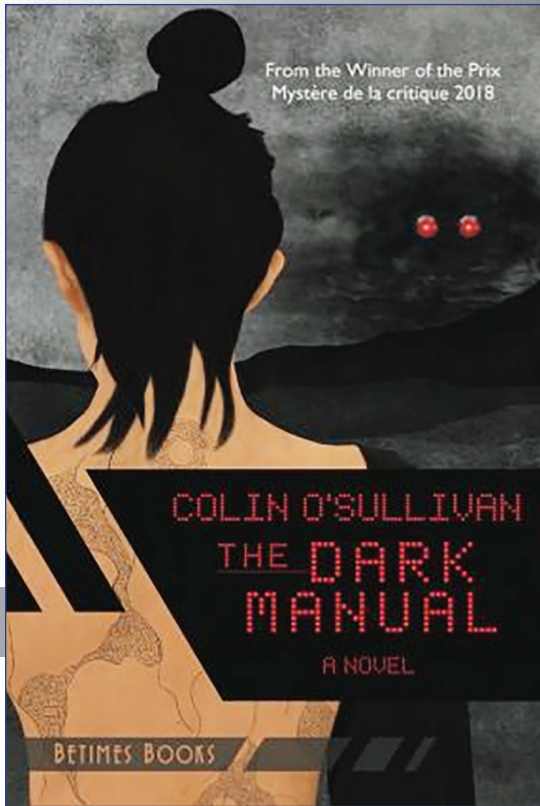

Apple TV+ has ordered a 10-episode series for *"Sunny"* (aka *The Dark Manual*), a half-hour comedic drama starring and executive produced by Rashida Jones. The dark comedy stars Jones as Suzie, an American woman living in Kyoto, Japan, whose life is

upended when her husband and son disappear in a mysterious plane crash.

Susie Sakamoto, an Irishwoman in Japan, spends her days drinking heavily and cursing the home robot that takes care of all her domestic needs. She despises the thing her dead husband designed and is under the impression that it is about to do her harm.

To escape the overwhelming grief of her missing family, she takes to the nighttime and the lawless section of the city, loitering in seedy bars with her wild, drug-fuelled, hypersexual friend, Mixxy.

Are Susie's persecutions merely a result of her own paranoia? Can the parliament of owls gathering eerily in the trees outside be of any significance, any assistance? Or will she have to search for the mythic Dark Manual, to find a way to finally switch off the homebot and end her litany of woes?

...it might already be too late...the machines are on the rise.

Japan-based award-winning Irish writer Colin O'Sullivan couples his usual lyrical flourishes with tense and often terrifying noir-ish scenes, to present before us an unsettling vision of an anxious woman teetering in an anxious time. 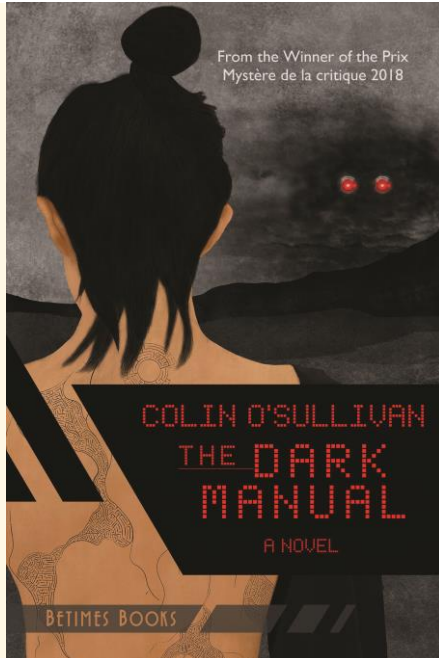

As reported by *Deadline Hollywood*, “Apple TV+ has handed a formal 10-episode series order to *Sunny* (aka *The Dark Manual*), a half-hour darkly comedic drama starring and executive produced by **Rashida Jones**, from **Katie Robbins** (*The Affair*, *The Last Tycoon*) and A24. **Lucy Tcherniak** (*Station Eleven*, *The End of the F***ing World*) is attached to direct.

Written by Robbins, *Sunny*, which had been eyeing a green light for a while, is based on the book *The Dark Manual*, by Japan-based award-winning Irish writer **Colin O'Sullivan**.

The dark comedy stars Jones as Suzie, an American woman living in Kyoto, Japan, whose life is upended when her husband and son disappear in a mysterious plane crash. As “consolation” she’s given Sunny, one of a new class of domestic robots made by her husband’s electronics company. Though at first Suzie resents Sunny’s attempts to fill the void in her life, gradually they develop an unexpected friendship, as together they uncover the dark truth of what really happened to Suzie’s family, becoming dangerously enmeshed in a world Suzie never knew existed.”

The series is expected to film in Japan in April.

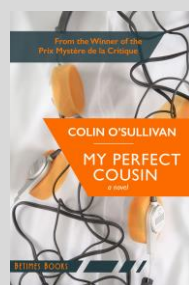
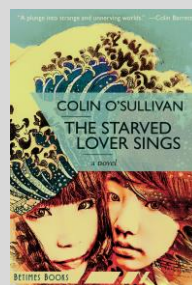
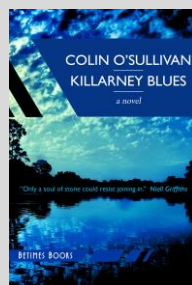

Alladi is a science fiction gender-flipped retelling of Alladin, set in a far-future city on an obsolete world in a spacefaring society. It's Alladin meets MURDERBOT. A novel about power, empire, colonialism, disaster capitalism and migration woven around themes of ambition and idealism and how they can affect family and friendship.

ALLADI is a young woman of Shantipot. a sinking, megapolis currently under its fourth and final colonial era. Alladi's world, once the red tape is dealt with is going to be foreably evacuated and put up for sale. Most inhabitants have either evacuated, or been herded out as contract laborers. Alladi's love of her city and magi-lev carpet tours through the remaining exciting city neighbourhoods, gives her an edge as a state-appointed tourist guide. Her parents' talented tech-weilders, managed to end-run their arranged marriages and marry each other. Her father went native and secretly joined the resistance, using his Tiger clan clout to become a resistance smuggler. He died in mysterious circumstances, leaving Alladi with a dream of saving her beloved city from evacuation, restoring her mother's status, and finding out once and for all who killed her father.

A woman with great parkour skills and Bader-Bot, a cranky monkey, who is also an Adoptive Battle Unit (shape-shifting combat robot). Bader-bot is high end Tiger Clan military tech that Alladi's father integrated with smuggled, possibly alien synth-tech and overloaded with emotion algorithms and shaped into a monkey. Bader-bot is a passionate AI equality activist and wants to become a space hero in his own time.
