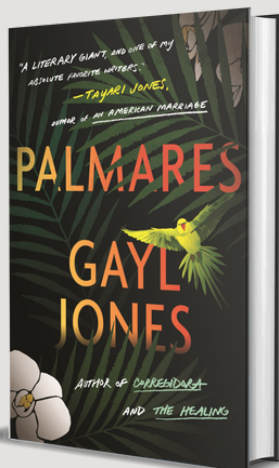
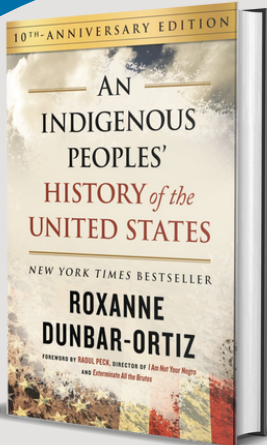
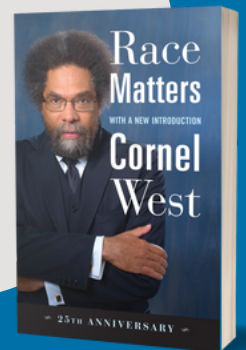
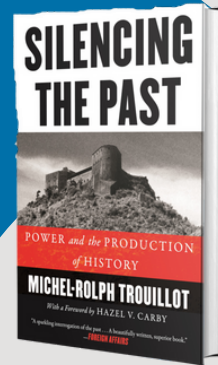
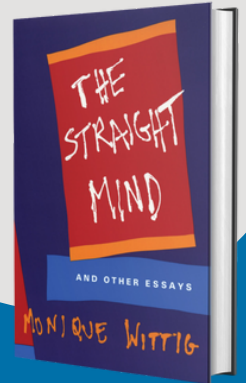
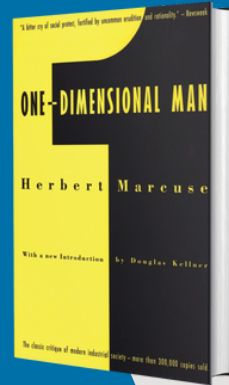
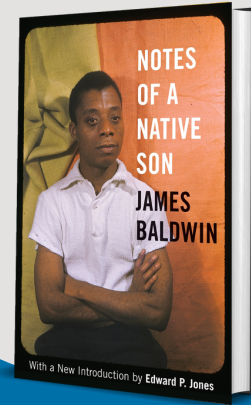


## **OUR MISSION**

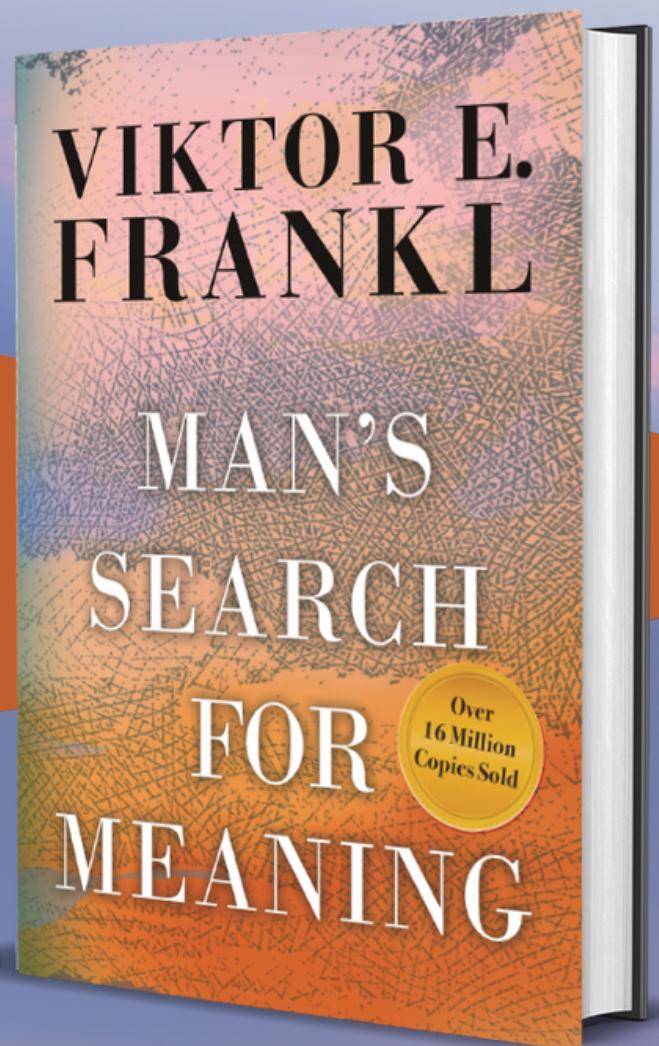

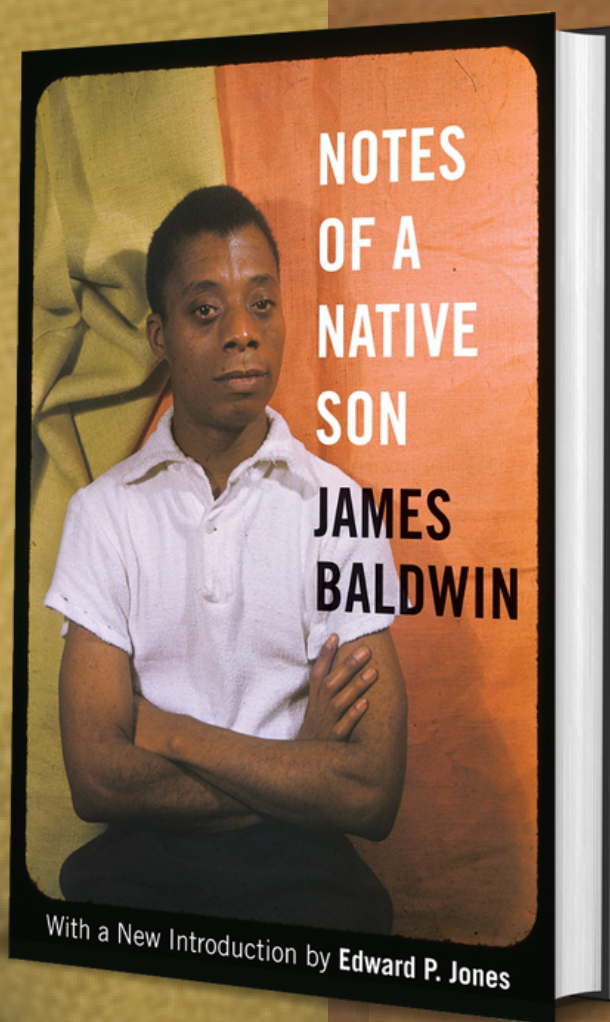

## JAMES BALDWIN (1924-1987)

James Baldwin was one of America's foremost writers. He was an African American novelist, essayist, playwright, poet, and social critic. Baldwin's essays, such as "Notes of a Native Son" (1955), explore palpable yet unspoken intricacies of racial, sexual, and class distinctions in Western societies, most notably in mid-20th-century America.

From 1948, Baldwin made his home primarily in the south of France, but often returned to the USA to lecture or teach. His novels include *Giovanni's Room* (1956) and *Another Country* (1962), about racial and gay sexual tensions among New York intellectuals. As an openly gay man, he became increasingly outspoken in condemning discrimination against lesbian and gay people.
