The Wolf in the Sun, the first book in a proposed series of four, is a fast-paced, fantasy adventure novel written by a highly talented Indigenous writer of Cree descent. The middle-grade book is set in a fantastical world in which humans (The Forgotten Ones) are extinct and many animals are now sentient...

Silversong is a lowly member of the Whistle Wind pack of wolves, all can manipulate wind and air as a defense mechanism or weapon. Other packs of the Four Territories can manipulate other elements like water, fire and earth. All live under the Wolven Code, a hierarchical system with a strict code of conduct. Any wolf who breaks the Wolven Code is banished to the Furtherlands, a corrupted land where outcast wolves are led by an enigmatic wolf called the Heretic.

In the story, Silversong wishes to prove himself after a devastating attack on his pack but gets caught up in a battle against a great enemy and in a quest to find an artifact that could benefit or destroy his world. Fans of the Erin Hunter's work (*Warriors*, *Seekers*, *Bravelands*, etc.), *The Wings of Fire* series and *Avatar The Last Airbender* will find much to love in Silversong's quest and the colorful cast of characters.

THE ACTIVIST'S GUIDE TO SPEECHWRITING FOR A BETTER FUTURE

When it comes to the climate emergency, kids don't need any convincing that it's real, and that we must take action. Kids need skills to go beyond the obvious actions, like recycling and reducing their own carbon footprint. They need skills to start a movement, and speak out. The UN just declared that kids have a right to sue their governments for ignoring or furthering the climate emergency. *SPEAKING ON CLIMATE* will help them speak for their future, in their communities or in the court of human rights.

This book gives kids powerful tools so they can go beyond what they already know to help save our dying planet. It shows readers how to persuade audiences with powerful emotions, instead of facts. It explains how phrases like “climate change” are intentionally used to lead societies and individuals to a state of inaction, and how we can use new words and framing to speak truth to power. It prioritizes hope and history over fear and obscurity, so kids can mobilize for action and change.

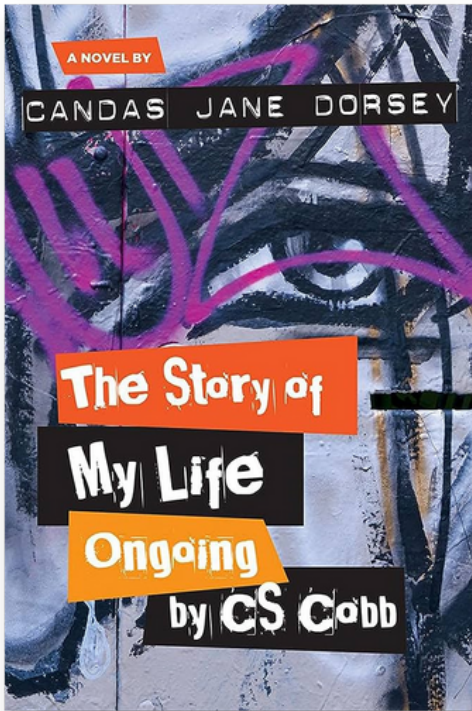
Will Rook and Gage escape the traps and perils that await them in order to save each other's worlds? If they don't, it could very well be the end of humanity.
